Ceramics 2018: Concepts and techniques

Ceramic restorations have become more popular in recent years given the growing esthetic demands of patients and a more cholistic view of a 'metal-free' mouth. This presentation will focus on ceramics in private practice to give the clinician a better understanding of the selection, fabrication techniques, and anticipated performance of these materials.

Recognize the various types of commercially available dental ceramics.

Compare and contrast the physical properties as they relate to indications for use.

Appreciate how these differences translate into important consequences that can impact treatment planning and clinical practice.
