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The return of study hall: The influence of teacher/student interaction outside the classroom on student academic success

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Previous research shows the significance of interaction with instructors in informal settings as a positive contributor to the student's intellectual and personal growth. Whether your students are traditional, non-traditional, campus based, or blended online, interaction with the instructor outside the classroom contributes to their academic success. Study hall provides an opportunity for reflection, learner directed activities, development of interpersonal skills and mentoring This presentation will discuss "study hall" as a method to enhance the pedagogy of engagement Additionally, the presentation will offer examples of the criteria for "study hall" Finally, the presentation will provide student feedback of piloting "study hall" in the Ohio University Southern School of Nursing Program.
