An innovative strategy for students' engagement in nursing education: Smartphone use in active teaching & learning

Introduction: The rigor in nursing education makes it imperative for nursing faculty to continuously innovate strategies to engage the students. However, attrition continues in nursing education despite the use of traditional strategies, active learning strategies, and technologies in a didactic face-to-face learning environment.

Study Goal: To explore the perceptions of undergraduate nursing students regarding the combined use of active learning strategies and technology, precisely, smart phones in a didactic face –to-face teaching/learning environment. The study also explored effective ways of using smart phones in a didactic face-to-face learning environment to improve academic engagement and reduce the level of attrition in <u>nursing education</u>.

Methods: A qualitative study of undergraduate nursing students at different levels, using semi-structure interview and manual data analysis, using the following framework analysis steps; <u>familiarization</u>, identifying a thematic framework, indexing, charting and synthesis, mapping, and interpretation (Nikpeyma, Zolfaghari & Mohammadi, 2021).

Conclusion: The combined use of active learning strategies and smart phone in an undergraduate nursing course will improve academic engagement and promote the desired outcome of academic success, reduce the level of attrition and improve the rate of passing nursing board examination, the NCLEX-RN.
