Editorial Note for Journal of Andrology and Gynecology: Current Research

I am pleased to mention about the Journal of Andrology and Gynecology: Current Research that during the year 2019, all Issues of volume 7 were published online well within the time and the print issues were also brought out and dispatched within 30 days of publishing the issue online.

Journal of Andrology and Gynecology: Current Research is an open access, peer-reviewed, half yearly, multidisciplinary journal that considers articles on reproductive system of males and females, and other related health issues. Andrology deals with basic and clinical aspects of the male reproductive system (gonads, endocrine and accessory organs) in all species, including the diagnosis and treatment of medical problems associated with sexual development, infertility, sexual dysfunction, sex hormone action and other urological problems. Gynecology deals with the medical practice of health of the female reproductive system (vagina, uterus, and ovaries).

The Impact factor of AGCR for the year 2019 was 1.36 and is constantly in the direction of maintaining and improving the Impact factor.

During the calendar year 2019, AGCR received a total of 10 papers, out of which 6 articles (60%) were rejected in the preliminary screening due to plagiarism or being out of the format and peer review process. During 2019 around 4 articles were subjected for publication after they are accepted in the peer review process. In the 6 issues of Volume 7 published during the year 2019, a total of 4 articles were published (at an average of 2 articles per issue) of which, articles were published from authors all around the world. A total of 68 research scientists from all over the world reviewed the 10 articles published in volume 7.

During the calendar year 2019, a total of 5 Editors, 17 Reviewers joined the board of AGCR and contributed their invaluable services towards contribution as well as publication of articles.

I take this opportunity to acknowledge the contribution of David Mutch, Editor-in-Chief during the final editing of articles published and the support rendered by the editorial assistant, Evelyn Ross in bringing out issues of AGCR in time. I would also like to express my gratitude to all the authors, reviewers, the publisher, the advisory and the editorial board of AGCR, the office bearers for their support in

bringing out yet another volume of AGCR and look forward to their unrelenting support to bring out the Volume 8 of AGCR in scheduled time.
